Questions included in the interview guide for participants

Question:	Potential Question-Specific Probes:
1) We will talk about various specific aspects of the CPR in a bit. n/a But, first, I would like to hear your initial reaction to the CPR in one sentence?	
2) What do you think about the appearance of the CPR?	Is the CPR visually appealing? Is the resource easy to follow? Is the font size easy to read? Is the CPR easy to read throughout?
3) Do you believe the layout of the CPR is logical and would be easy to complete?	Is the wording of each question clear? Is there enough space to include all the necessary information asked by each question? Are the questions asked in a logical order? Are the information panels presented in a logical order? Do the tables help with the presentation of information? Could the information in the table be presented in a better way?
4) Does anything appear particularly hard to use or understand about the CPR? Is anything unclear?	Can you tell me a bit more about that? What made these components hard/unclear? Do you have any recommendations

5) Is there anything that is particularly easy to use and understand about the CPR?

6) In your opinion, what parts of the CPR are the most useful to you as parents/a respite worker of children with intellectual disabilities?

7) Is there any information that is not covered in the CPR that you think is necessary?
